





DEATH both COLLAPSES distinctions and CLARIFIES values.

EXPOSURE AND DEATH: VISION "Muscle Man," Vesalius's De Fabrica

The Revenger: a self-exposing anatomy;

An ANATOMIST with PRIVILEGED PERSPECTIVE;

MEDIATES between life and death;

Revenge drama: a machine to "bring to light" the hidden interior of things.



DEATH AND EROTICISM

Conspiracy is by nature EROTIC:

•The half-seen/half-hidden; •Masquerade of partial, teasing

exposure;

•Death as the TELOS:

 the stripping away of pretense;
the collapse of SURFACES into SUBSTANCE.

Mechanisms of Exposure

•REUNITE APPEARANCE AND REALITY

- 1. DISGUISE (self-revealing surfaces E.G. Rapine and Murder in TA);
- 2. EAVESDROPPING (dramatic irony; transforms "insides" into "outsides/privacy into public display);
- SPECTRAL VISITATION (outside knowledge or projection of inner anxiety);
- 4. MADNESS (SELF-LOSS→SELF-DIS-COVERY)
- 5. ENGINEERING CHARACTERS (servants, dependents);
- 6. PREGNANCY/VIRGINITY TESTS ("Truth is the daughter of time");
- SEXUAL PENETRATION (breaching of boundaries between inner/outer worlds);
- 8. LEGAL PROCEEDINGS (trials, executions, gallows speeches)
