INSTRUCTIONS:

This is a *summative* project. Therefore, the seminar presentation must demonstrate your overall knowledge of the material. It is strongly recommended that you choose a theme or concept or question that runs through the course as a whole.

Your presentation will be 20 minutes in duration, plus 10 minutes of discussion.

You may use visual or other presentation aids but these are not mandatory. Choose a presentation style that is best suited to the subject matter and your goals.

You must engage the audience in the creation of knowledge through discussion or some other exercise.

- 1. CHOOSE your own topic for your seminar presentation. The presentation must address AT LEAST TWO (2) of the texts on the syllabus;
- 2. ASK a valid research question;
- 3. ARGUE a valid thesis and support your argument with reference to both the primary texts and the critical field (I.e. you must include a research component);
- 4. If using PPT or other visual aids, use them judiciously and follow the guidelines for effective presentations;
- 5. ENGAGE the audience through discussion or DESIGN an appropriate class exercise to help to illustrate your ideas;
- 6. DO NOT read a prepared paper;
- 7. HAND IN a hard copy of your slides/presentation notes.

YOU WILL HAND IN FOR GRADE:

- 1. The assignment template from the top of this document;
- 2. Your notes or slides with notes;
- 3. A Works Cited in proper MLA format.

ASSESSMENT:

- Concision, clear language, appropriate format;
- Tidiness, care for presentation;
- Accurate MLA citation and documentation;
- Valid and significant thesis;
- Detailed references to the texts;
- Evidence of application of ideas, conceptual tools, definitions etc.;
